2. Presentation by Deputy Faith Nadel

- This was a special meeting with a larger attendance to discuss volunteer programs.
- Deputy Nadel is responsible for various training and volunteer programs, including:

A - Citizens Academy

This is a 12 week program for citizens to learn about the HCSO and what deputies do.

There have been 500 graduates since 1997.

There are three classes scheduled per year.

Training is conducted on Thursday nights and also two Saturdays during the period.

#### B - Volunteer Programs

Can volunteer to perform administrative type work, parking enforcement, ham radio operations,  
and volunteer band.

Currently have 122 volunteers in the County who expend 14,000 hours/year supporting HCSO.

#### C - Volunteer Citizens Patrol

This is a pilot program that will be conducted in Apollo Beach and Westchase. A total of 50 volunteers will be trained to perform non-risk tasks that will free up deputies.

Activities include vacation watch, graffiti watch, suspicious persons or vehicles, blocking off

road obstructions and relief when crossing guards are unavailable.

There will be 40 hours of training required over two weeks.

A vehicle will be provided for 2-person volunteers to increase visibility in the area.

Two shifts will be manned, 7 days/week (6am-noon and noon-6pm).

3. The Apollo Beach HCSO substation is celebrating its' tenth anniversary. The substation office is located between Pinch-A-Penny and Publix on US41 at Apollo Beach Boulevard.
